

Area of a triangle:

$$A = \frac{b \cdot h}{2}$$

The base and height are perpendicular (form right angles)

Area of a rectangle or parallelogram:

$$A = b \cdot h$$

The base and height are perpendicular (form right angles)

Area of a square:

$$A = s \cdot s \text{ or } s^2$$

“s” stands for “side”

Area of a trapezoid:

$$A = \frac{(b_1 + b_2)}{2} \cdot h$$

The bases (b_1 & b_2) are the parallel sides. The height is perpendicular to the bases (it forms right angles with the bases)

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
